**Cowdray Farm Shop Tasting Day** - The choir will sing Christmas carols during the Cowdray Farm Shop 'Christmas Tasting Day' on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November. ### Easebourne Park is the People's Choice!

We're delighted to confirm that Easebourne Park has been announced as winner of the People's Choice Award at the South Downs National Park Design Awards.

This is wonderful recognition of our much loved public space and we'd like to thank everyone who voted for it.

Next proposed big development for the Park is the construction of a community multi-use covered shelter that we are planning for the first half of 2020, thanks to funding from the Community Lottery



Fund and Chichester District Council and materials for the chestnut wood structure donated by Cowdray Estate.

In a further boost, the Parish Council has received £80,000 from the local authority's Community Investment Levy (CIL), a charge that is set on new developments to allow investment in local infrastructure, facilities and services. The funding will allow us to continue to develop the Park, adding facilities and enhancing the environment.

Thank you to everyone involved in making the park what it is.
