Sussex Cross Country Event



An incredible performance at MRC's cross country event led to four children from Easebourne qualifying to represent the Central Sussex Area in the Sussex School Games 2022 Cross Country Finals. This event involved competing against children from the whole county. The race distance was over 2km for all contestants from Easebourne.

We are awaiting finalised individual race results but I can confirm that our area were outstanding with one of the Year 6 boys finishing 2nd in his race and the Year 6 girls' team finishing with a Silver overall. This is a huge achievement and, again, I am incredibly proud of the children for showing their dedication to sport at both an individual and team level!
