Coronavirus

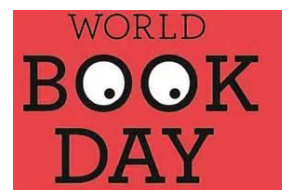
We are also preparing for possible school closure. If, as seems likely, schools across England are closed, we intend to put the following in place:

- Class teachers will use Teachers2Parents e-mails to contact all of the parents of the children in their class with an overview of the organisation of class learning during this period of closure and with their individual school e-mail addresses; teachers will check their e-mails twice a day, replying to any parent queries.
- Class teachers will prepare a 2-week learning pack for each child, indicating the prioritisation of the learning – this will include maths, reading, writing, spelling and additional activities. The packs will be collected by parents from school and will contain any necessary stationery.

- Moodle will be used as the virtual learning platform with details of the learning sent out, along with links to websites and additional learning resources. The Office will ensure that all parents have log-in details for Moodle so that they and their children can access it.

World Book Week – Thursday 5th March

On World Book Day, children were invited to come to school dressed as their favourite book character and they had the opportunity to hear staff read their favourite book.



The librarians also held a 3D model competition. Children created characters from their favourite book to hang in the library. The library now looks even more splendid, with the new book characters on display. Our congratulations go to the winners whose names are displayed in the library.

Fairtrade

Two recent events have been celebrated at Easebourne CE Primary School. One, Fairtrade Fortnight, encouraged us to reflect on the situation of those often struggling to make enough to support their families whilst the other, World Book Day, encouraged us to celebrate just how rich the world of children's literature is, for children and adults alike.

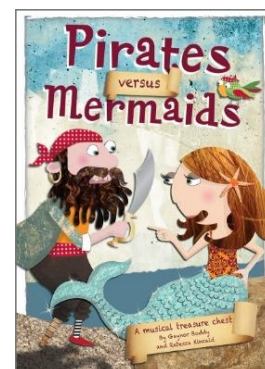


In Fairtrade Fortnight, our houses competed to bring in as many labels from Fairtrade items as they could in an inter-house competition. It reminded the children just how many products there are where shoppers can be sure that producers are receiving a fair price for their labour. Children brought in everything from the more obvious products such as coffee, tea and biscuits to slightly less obvious ones like flowers and vanilla bean extract! And, of course, there was lots of packaging from chocolate! After school, on the two Wednesdays in the fortnight, children sold Divine chocolate bars sourced through Traidcraft. Trade was brisk and the children sold 148 bars!

Clubs

Please note that clubs finish for this term on Friday 27th March. The new clubs list will be emailed to parents on Friday 27th March and in the interest of fairness no forms will be accepted until Monday morning. Forms should be returned by 3 pm on Tuesday 31st March. When the closing date for applications has been reached we will allocate all 1st choices where possible and then allocate 2nd choices etc until a club reaches capacity.

Please note, for Cooking Club, priority will be given to those children who were on the waiting list this term **if they put the club as their first choice for the Summer Term.**

If any parents, grandparents, volunteers, governors or friends of Easebourne would be able to run or assist with a club, please let the office know. In particular, we are looking for **support** with a Gardening Club on a Thursday (you do not need to be an expert) and a Running Club on a Monday 3.15-4.15pm.

Scholastic Book Club

Your child should have come home with the latest Scholastic Book Club catalogue. If you wish to make an order, **the deadline is Friday 20th March**. For every £1.00 you spend on books, our school will earn 20p in Scholastic Rewards to purchase books for our school library.

Free School Meals

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

This provides funding to the school not only to fund a free meal but to support eligible pupils with their learning and help towards the cost of school trips, buying educational equipment and with the purchasing of school uniforms.

Parents of children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in receipt of state benefits which give entitlement to free school meals for their children should register even though their child is entitled to Universal Infant Free School meals.

Nut Allergy

Almost every school in the country has at least one pupil with a nut allergy and we have an above average number of sufferers. Although it is impossible to guarantee that we are a nut free school, we do ask that parents do not include nuts or products containing nuts in their child's packed lunch or as a snack. We thank you for your consideration.

Please also consider whether your child is using a handcream that contains nut oils.

Work starts on next stage of development for Easebourne Park

All of this has been made possible after our successful bids for funding from Chichester District Council, The Grange Community Association, The National Lottery and the South Downs National Park Community Infrastructure Levy.
