KIT Books

This year, for a range of reasons, we are amalgamating our three termly KIT Books into one for the whole year. There is an environmental benefit as this will cut down paper wastage as there are less covers and the 'standing items' in each book are only produced once. It also brings with it a saving on staff time as the books only need to be produced once. Both of the above also bring with them a financial saving to the school. Finally, you and your child will have a more complete overview of the year which we feel will be beneficial. The down side is that the books will need to survive for a whole year and we will be encouraging children to take good care of them and would appreciate parents' support in this. We hope not to need another print run during the year so we have printed off a few spares in case one goes missing or needs replacing, but these will be available for £1.

Seaford

We recently welcomed students from Seaford College as part of their Community Action Day initiatives. Parents may remember that, last year, students came and designed a mosaic on the central planter in the courtyard. This year, running with an idea suggested by Karen Bellamy, a parent and the mastermind behind the children's planting activities this year, the students built a planter out of old pallets. This feature links our raised beds outside the school and will give a great growing space for strawberries. Our thanks go to Angie who accompanied the team and to Karen Bellamy and Richard Parr for the preparation and liaison involved.

Vine House

Following on from Badgers Class's visit to Birthday House during Community Week, pupils from Year 3 visited Vine House. Both sessions were very successful, with the children performing and then socialising with the residents. A huge thank-you to Katie Stevens for organizing these two trips. We hope to build further on these two links next year.

We are blessed with a wonderful site, both in terms of its location and its range of ecosystem. As part of Community Week, all classes took a part of the school grounds and looked carefully at the biodiversity that they found there. This is the start of an ongoing project to fully discover the richness of the flora and fauna that surrounds us at school. Library Books

Please ensure all library books are returned to school by the end of this term. We monitor the Junior Librarian system closely and children are made aware if a book is overdue. Any child that has an overdue book for longer than half a term will receive a letter asking for the book to be replaced or the cost covered by their parent. If children have a book outstanding at the end of the academic year a letter will be sent in September.

If you have any suitable books at home that you no longer require, then do please think of donating them to our library, we are always grateful for new stock.

Summer Reading Challenge

Every year, we encourage our pupils to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge and this forms the first house competition of the new academic year - every child who gains a certificate will earn a point for his or her house. Next week, a representative from the West Sussex Library Service will speak in assembly about this year's challenge, 'Space Chase'; celebrating the 50th anniversary of the first moon landing. Chartwells Meals and Cool Milk

Please remember when ordering milk or lunches for September to **adjust your child's class name and** year group.

Children currently in Year 2 moving up to Year 3 in September will no longer be eligible for Universal Infant Free School Meals but can order a hot meal for £2.35 a day from Chartwells or bring in a packed lunch. To order a hot meal please log onto <u>www.mealselector.co.uk</u> for more information. The order must be placed on-line by midnight on Sunday a full week in advance of the week they are required. Parents wishing to change their meal schedule after placing their order (e.g. in the event of term time holiday, school trips etc.) must make on-line alterations prior to the cut-off point for the week in question, alternatively you can contact the Chartwells office via telephone or email. A credit will only be issued if they receive 5 full working days notice. In the event of absence from school due to sickness, meals may be cancelled provided Chartwells receive notification by 10.30am on each day of sickness.

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 in September you are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. You do not need to register and order through the website. The school will order these meals for you. This will include any promotional/festive special meals. Current Reception and Year 1 children will receive a letter before the end of term giving them the option to opt in or out of Universal Infant Free School Meals. This must be returned by the end of term.

Free School Meals

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals. Your child is eligible for free school meals if you're in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400.
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

This provides funding to the school not only to fund a free meal but to support eligible pupils with their learning and help towards the cost of school trips, buying educational equipment and with the purchasing of school uniforms.

Parents of children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in receipt of state benefits which give entitlement to free school meals for their children should register <u>even though their child is entitled to Universal</u> Infant Free School meals.

Second Parent Request

In the case of families where parents are separated or divorced it is the school policy to provide second copies of correspondence if requested by the parent. Please provide the school with an up to date address, email and telephone number and keep us informed of any changes to the information provided. We will send:

- a newsletter fortnightly by email
- a diary termly by email. Dates can also be found on the website
- an invitation to parents evenings in the Autumn and Spring Term
- a report, which will be posted at the end of the Summer Term

We will also email or post any other important letters or invitations but will not send second copies of general letters regarding trips, swimming, Forest School etc.

Medicines

If we hold medication for your child in school, please make sure you collect it from the office on the last day of term. We will send medicines home with a new form to complete for the next academic year. Please ensure you check the expiry date on all medicines and wash out any pumps. We have arranged a number of days before the term starts when the office will be open, Friday 30th August 9-12.30 and Monday 2nd September from 10.30 – 3.30. It is essential that you return any medication before the start of the new term.

Easebourne Park News.

<u>Picnic-In-The-Park</u>. *Help us celebrate the 1st birthday of Easebourne Park by joining us for a Picnic in the Park!*

Saturday 31st August from 1pm to 5pm. Live music, ice-cream van, bar, soft drinks, Cowdray Tuk-Tuk. Please place this event in your diary.

<u>Toddler's Play Equipment</u>. The installation of the Toddler's Fort will take place during the week commencing 15 July and will be complete before the start of the school holidays. This imaginative Fort, echoing the form of the Cowdray ruins, is designed for pre-school children and has been acquired after much consultation with parishioners. Additionally, a fully accessible roundabout will also be installed at the same time and in the same general area after another generous donation to the community Park by the Boltini Trust.

<u>Community multi-purpose covered shelter</u>. Fund-raising and design has commenced for this next project for our community Park. This multi-use covered shelter was also identified as being a community priority as a result of our recent survey. Whilst designs are at an early stage, we plan that this robust open structure, designed to sit comfortably and in harmony with the Park, as well as inside the wider South Downs National Park surroundings, will comprise local timber kindly donated from the Cowdray Estate, involve minimal ground disturbance, and have a sustainable sedum grass roof covering. There will be a big inside space and some peripheral seating. The shelter will have a ramp to ensure full access for all. When? This depends



upon success with fund-raising efforts. By the end of 2019 or during the first half of 2020 is the present aspiration.
