Community Week

Community Week has not quite finished but it has been very busy so far. On Monday, Chrissie Abbott took our assembly, talking to the children and answering questions about the Midhurst Foodbank.

On Tuesday morning, Sister Marguerita visited and led an assembly. Sister Marguerita, one of the Catholic nuns who taught at the Midhurst Convent, gave simple and powerful illustrations of how mean, thoughtless words could not be unsaid. She also spoke about how the advice that we should never judge a book by its cover applied to people every bit as much as to books. Sister Marguerita then spent time with Squirrels. After lunch, Hamza came in and talked to Badgers about Islam which they have been learning about as part of their curriculum. He answered questions and also visited Squirrels. Meanwhile, Rabbits were cleaning St Mary's Church with Alison and Roger, the churchwardens.

Alison wrote this:

A lady visited the church whilst the children were cleaning and looked somewhat surprised. Thinking she may be visiting the church for some peace and quiet time, I spoke to her to apologise and explain. Totally the opposite, she was delighted to see the children in church, having fun. Yesterday, groups of Year 6 pupils visited the foodbank to pack boxes for families in need over the summer holidays. Meanwhile, David Crook, recently the curate at St Mary's and school governor, returned to take our assembly. He talked about being brave when taking the next step in our journeys in life.

Today, Mrs Holloway, a parent and fellow teacher, came in and led a dodgeball session with all of Hedgehogs. Our thanks to her for her time and for leading a similar session with Foxes earlier in the term. We also welcomed Will Ashley-Norman, a sculptor in wire, who worked with some of Foxes Class on our prayer tree project whilst other members of the class took part in a rounders tournament in South Harting. Badgers Class sang and danced for the residents of Birthday House and next week Rabbits will do the same for the residents of Vine House. Meanwhile, some of Otters visited the Cowdray Farm Shop to find out about their initiative to cut down on single use plastic

Midhurst Foodbank

In advance of the children's visit, Mike and Chrissie Abbott sent this information about the foodbank.

Dear Parents.

I just wanted to remind you about the close working relationship the School has with Midhurst Foodbank Centre. For example, as part of Community Week, Year 6 children will be helping to pack Holiday Lunchboxes this Thursday at the Foodbank.

In addition, the School are (red) voucher holders for the Foodbank which means that any person or family in need can ask at the office, Mr Culley or me personally and in confidence to issue a voucher. This can then be exchanged for food at the Foodbank. It can also provide toiletries, pet food, and additional "non -standard" food items wherever possible, so there are real advantages to calling in to the Foodbank in person if these "extras" are also needed.

I should also remind all parents whose children receive free school meals during term-time, that the Foodbank also makes Lunchboxes available during the holidays, and the School will issue these additional vouchers.

The Foodbank is located at St Ann's Hall, St Ann's Hill (just behind Garton's coffee shop in the Market Square, Midhurst) and is open between 3.00pm-5.00pm on Friday afternoons. They also provide a 24/7 mobile delivery service (tel. 07826-397732) for those who have vouchers but find it difficult to reach St Ann's Hall.

It is great to have this service from the Foodbank, which is run entirely by volunteers.

You can still enter Flag Competition 02 by collecting a question sheet from Reception and returning it filled in.


TIGHT WRITE 08/09

Summer Fair - is tomorrow 1pm - 4pm. We look forward to seeing you there. Thank you to all those who have volunteered to run stalls or help in any way. It is very much appreciated. We have a variety of outside stall holders coming this year and together with stalls from the school it promises to be fun and entertaining for all the family.

Please note that there will not be a BBQ at the fair as we were unable to get any volunteers to run it. However, we will have cakes, savouries, Strawberries & Cream an Indian food stall and an ice cream van.

In an effort to reduce sugar and plastic prizes, we will be operating a token system this year. Game players are able to win 1, 2 or 3 tokens which they can collect and spend at the prize table. Stalls will be priced at 25p - 50p with multi buys for £1. The bouncy castle will be £1.50 for 5 minutes or an unlimited pass for £4. As we only have one bouncy castle this year we will be running age sessions (toddler - 6yrs and 7yrs - 11yrs). Please remember that children remain the responsibility of their parents/carers for the duration of the event.

We will have a First Aid tent supplied and manned by Easebourne Scouts and this is also where the 'Lost Children' point is located.

Parking for the event will be the teachers' car park and the main car park by the Easebourne play park. We will also be opening up the playground for parking. Please **DO NOT** park on the school driveway, roundabout, road down to the lower car park, along the wooden fence by the music room/old school building, on the double yellow lines or on the yellow cross-hatching. **These areas**MUST be made accessible for emergency vehicles and owners who leave their cars in these locations will be asked to move them.
