

#### **Staff News**

#### Covid-19 – 6 Day Test and Trace during the Christmas Holidays

The DfE is recommending that all schools make sure that their staff and parents/carers are aware of the following information and relevant arrangements regarding positive cases in the holidays:

- For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member <u>tests positive</u> for coronavirus (COVID-19), <u>having developed symptoms</u> <u>within 48 hours of being in school</u>, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. We would ask you to contact <u>both</u> Sharon Bennington <u>and</u> me by e-mail. Between us, we will check our e-mails and work with the DfE and PHE advisers to identify next steps regarding potential infection at school.

- Where a pupil or staff member <u>tests positive</u> for coronavirus (COVID-19), <u>having developed</u> <u>symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school</u>, there is no need to contact the school but parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Public Health England guidance states that for most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild illness. If your child does develop symptoms, you can seek advice from the nhs.uk website at <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms/">https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms/</a>. If you are concerned about your child's symptoms, or they are worsening you can seek advice from NHS 111 at <a href="https://111.nhs.uk/">https://111.nhs.uk/</a> or by phoning 111.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of:

- a new continuous cough
- a high temperature

• a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

Please remember to:

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards.

#### Free School Meals and WSCC Community Hub

This week, those families that are eligible for Free School Meals should have received a text and email with details of how to access a voucher for the Christmas holiday period.

Those children and families that are not eligible for FSM will be able to access support for food and essentials via the WSCC Community Hub. The Community Hub can be contacted on 0330 222 7980 and is open 8am-8pm, 7 days a week, and will be operational throughout the Christmas Holiday period.

#### Clubs

For those of you who have already signed up for clubs next term payment, requests will be sent in the first week of term. As of today, there are not enough children signed up in Years 4, 5 and 6 for these club to break even.
