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### **Heavy Horses**

On Tuesday, we received a visit from two very impressive individuals who towered above not only the children but also all of the adults! These were two Canadian Belgian heavy horses. They were brought to the school by David Mouland who has 10 of these massive animals at his stable in Fordingbridge. They arrived in a huge transporter and David gave up his whole day to talk to the children about his horses which he had brought over from Canada. Although this breed is the most numerous of the heavy horse breeds in the world, there are very few in the UK and almost all belong to David. Though intimidating in stature, the horses were very gentle with the children and the visit was a great success. David was accompanied by Jumbo Lovatt who had kindly arranged the visit for the school. Jumbo is a well-known figure in the world of heavy horses and also a highly respected commentator in the field. During the day, he explained a little about heavy horses to the children. ### TIGHT WRITE 13



### Space Chase A-Z

In the Summer Activity Journal, you may remember that there was a Space Chase A-Z competition. This proved very popular and attracted many entries. There was, however, a slight glitch within the competition in that an image of a solar eclipse was printed instead of a lunar eclipse. One way or another, families found their way around this, some working with lunar eclipse, presumably guessing or not noticing that there had been an error, whilst others used their ingenuity to produce an alternative solution using solar eclipse, annular solar eclipse or simply eclipse as the answer. Anyway, to cut a long story short, great care was taken to ensure that everybody who deserved a prize got one – in all, there were 23 winners who all won a small prize and a house point. Well done, everybody!

### On-line Maths Practice (from Mrs Bedford)

As a school, we would like to encourage children to focus on using Times Table Rockstars (5-10 minutes a day) to improve their knowledge and recall speed of the times tables. This is because these core facts underpin a significant amount of the maths - from multiplication and division to fractions and area - that your child has to learn. If this information recall can be made automatic, it frees your child's working memory up so that they can concentrate on understanding a question or new concept rather than on performing a calculation.

In addition, some of you may have noticed that your child's login and password for Sumdog no longer works; this is because the school has taken the difficult decision not to renew its subscription to this site. However, if your child enjoys the games and would like to continue to play them at home, family subscriptions are available either for free (access to 6 games) or for a very small monthly fee.

### **Environment Day (from Mrs Clipston)**

Recently, we started the journey to becoming an international, Green Flag Award Eco-School. The programme is designed to raise environmental awareness amongst young people and in England it is run by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy. Internationally, the programme is the largest educational programme in the world, present in nearly 70 countries, with millions of children participating. Our school is now part of this global community, working to create environmental change for the benefit of our children and future generations.

The Eco-Schools programme empowers pupils, raises environmental awareness, improves the school environment and can also lead to financial saving. Being an active member of the programme will be something your child will remember for the rest of their life.

Every school taking part in the Eco-Schools programme around the world follow the same simple Seven Step framework. This usually takes schools between one and two academic years to complete. After achieving our first Green Flag, our school can continue in the programme and achieve multiple Green Flags whilst continuing to work on and promote environmental issues. One of the most exciting things about the programme is that the process is designed to engage the whole school and its wider community.

We are starting this process on Environment Day with each class looking at one of the following topics:

Biodiversity, Energy, Global Citizenship, Healthy Living, Litter, Marine Conservation, School Grounds, Transport, Waste and Water and sharing what we already do as a school and why it is important to the environment.

If you would like to get involved in the Eco-School programme by sharing your time, ideas or skills, please contact us directly. We will keep you updated of our progress.

We hope you are as excited about our eco-journey as we are.

As many of you are aware, at the end of last term we sent a letter to all parents of children in **KS2** asking that they supply stationery items for their child.

Although this was not requested, a number of children is KS1 have also decided to bring in a pencil case. ### Starting School Reception September 2020

If your child was born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016 they can start school in September 2020. From Monday 7th October 2019 to Wednesday 15th January 2020, you can apply online on the pupil Admissions Application website at www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions. Once you have submitted your online application you will receive an automatic email acknowledgement confirming that your email has been received. Free internet access to apply online is available at all West Sussex libraries and Children and Family Centres for parents who do not have access to a computer. Paper forms will only be issued to parents on request by phoning 0333 0142903 and forms need to be sent back to the Pupil Admissions Team by recorded delivery. Applications made after the closing date cannot be considered until all other applications have been dealt with. Online applicants will be notified which school their child has been offered by email during the day of Thursday 16th April 2020. Other applicants will be sent a letter by second class post, posted on 16th April.
