### KS<sub>1</sub>

**Hedgehogs -** This week Hedgehogs had 'The best day ever!' We went to the Weald and Downland Museum and spent the day in the sun walking around the site. We took part in a 'Childhood' workshop that involved visiting various historical houses. We found out that some families had up to 8 children and that the 8 children slept in 2 beds! We also found out that the school house was very small and not all children were allowed to attend. In another house, we found out that the toilet was open and dropped into the garden below! We ended the workshop by playing with some Victorian toys, including stilts. We walked around the wooded area, starting at a workshop where we learnt how to make linen. We carried on past the horses, stopping at various interesting spots, before returning back to the lake where we had lunch before feeding the ducks and drawing some of the buildings and finally heading home.

**Squirrels -** Squirrels have combined their recent computing lessons with maths and also PE. Our project has been about robots and how to make them move. We used lots of mathematical vocabulary such as left and right, forwards and backwards, clockwise and anti-clockwise and quarter and half turns. In our PE lesson we became human robots and directed our friends around an assault course. We also programmed the Beebots and guided them around courses that we had designed.





#### KS2

**Rabbits -** This week we have thoroughly enjoyed creating a new page for our book 'Leon and the Place Between'. We have looked really carefully at the style of the writing in the text to create our own pages and this has also included some research into new or different acts for a circus. We have also been able to create illustrations in the style of the text to accompany our writing and these are something we are very proud of. In Maths, we have been looking at fractions and comparing fractions which we have found particularly tricky, as fractions of shapes don't always look the same. A team of children had also been selected to play in a football tournament against other Rother Valley schools which was exciting and we hope to bring you good news of that next week!

**Badgers 4D** - The class have been exploring animal patterns and textures this week in Art & Design. They have started by drawing their own stylised version of a peacock feather, with a view to creating a lino print - we have been VERY carefully cutting out our designs!! Next, we looked at the patterns on butterfly wings and created our own design which we transferred into a pipe-cleaner printing block. Finally, we have been making our last printing block by exploring different animal textures and patterns (from reptilian scales to exotic fur and feathers). We are very excited to see the final results.

**Badgers 4H -** This week we have been learning about art! We learnt about printing and experimenting with different materials that go well together. I hated how mine looked but looking at everyone else's kind of inspired me to make something different. Written by Alex
